

Proposed 2018 Funding Strategy- Summary

FULLY FUNDED: Funding strategy where we are successful with all the funding applications outlined above.

- **Event 1:** Where OTF SEED funding is not approved*
 - \$67,000: Cost to fund proposed deliverables as outlined in the SEED Grant (July –Oct)
 - \$27,000: Cost to fund core function of Ag Outreach program (July to Sept)
- **Event 2:** Waiting for notification on OTF SEED and unsuccessful in other grants;
 - \$24,000: Cost to continue Ag Outreach programming with SVCA contract staff, with SEED deliverables in mind, until July.
- **Event 3:** Waiting for OTF SEED/TDFEF and where no GLGCF Gap end of April to June
 - \$16,000: Cost for SVCA contract staff position cover crop seed other budgeted items
- **Event 4:** Waiting for OTF SEED and have GLGF but no TDFEF
 - \$8,000: Costs for SVCA contract staff from end of May to July with SEED deliverables
- **NO FUNDING SUPPORT:** \$78,000: continues core Ag Outreach Program functions (April Oct)*
